## **Course Description**

This course is intended to provide an introduction to major theoretical perspectives informing communications studies. Students will be familiarized with the intellectual roots of various theories and will use theories to analyze and critically engage current issues. The goal is to provide students with the theoretical basis for carrying out their own thesis/dissertation research. Some of the traditions that will be covered include structuralism and poststructuralism, theories of meaning and discourse, structuration theory, the theory of communicative action, and a variety of critical theories relevant to the study of media and social communication.

The course will be organized as a seminar with brief lectures complemented by student presentations and class discussion. Students are expected to read the assigned readings each week before class, post responses to the readings, and be prepared to participate in active discussion of the material.

## **Plagiarism**

Using any source whatsoever without clearly documenting it is a serious academic offense. Consequences include failure on the assignment, failure in the course and possibly suspension or expulsion from the university.

You must document not only direct quotations but also paraphrases and ideas where they appear in your text. A reference list at the end is insufficient by itself. In-text citations must be provided, and readers must be able to tell exactly where your words and ideas end and other people's words and ideas begin. Wording taken directly from a source must be enclosed within quotation marks (or, for long quotations, presented in the format prescribed by the documentation style you are using). Paraphrased information must not follow the original wording and sentence structure with only slight word substitutions here and there. These requirements apply to all assignments and sources, including those in non-traditional formats such as Web pages or visual media.
