Depending of the final overall performance of the class, the minimum percentage required for any particular letter grade may be lowered. An average grade of 50% or higher in the laboratories and a weighted average of 50% or higher on examinations is required to attain a letter grade of C- or higher. The Faculty of Science requires a minimum grade of C- in any course to be used as a prerequisite.
