Official Course Description:

Spatial study of political systems, structures and processes and their relationship to geographic factors.

Prerequisite:

One of Geography 203, 251, 253, Urban Studies 201 or 253

Course Content:

Spatial study of political systems, structures and processes, and their relationship to geographic factors.

Organization:

Major topics to be discussed:

Territoriality; ancient states; state, nation and nation-state; emergence of states; theories about states; boundaries and frontiers; core areas and capitals; subnational divisions; colonialism; dismantling empires; 20th Century geopolitics; the American Century; the Cold War; supranationalism; globalization; devolution; contemporary geopolitics.

Presentation/Paper Specifications:

Students may present a formal oral presentation paper or a formal paper.

PRESENTATION OPTION: Presentation Teams of two or three people each will present a concise 20-minute presentation e.g., the expansion of the European Union. All topics must be approved by the Instructor. A detailed outline and annotated bibliography must be submitted on the lecture day prior to the talk.

PAPER OPTION: Students may substitute an 8-page paper.

The papers are due on March 30.
