Each piece of work (assignment, quiz, midterm examination, final examination) submitted by the student will be assigned a percentage score. The student's average percentage score for the various components will be combined with the indicated weights to produce an overall percentage for the course, which will be used to determine the course letter grade (bearing in mind that a grade of less than C– will result if the student does not pass the final examination).

Lyryx is offering students access to their Lyryx online homework at no cost when using University computers, including those in MS 317, MS 515, MS 521, MS 571, AFC, TFDL, and ES 160. The normal license fee will continue to be charged to students who choose to access Lyryx from off campus or other locations.
