Topics include the evolving roles of those traditionally served, professionals and professionally generated teams supporting those served, and broader social and technological theories, trends and issues surrounding individuals, professionals and systems. This is an interactive, inquiry based course to assist students to understand their current and potential contributions to the field. This course is instructed by the Community Rehabilitation and Disability Studies Program graduate faculty team.

b. CORE 631 (primary instructor, 3 credits)

Current topics relevant to inclusion and exclusion are reviewed. The ethical underpinnings of legislation, policy and service delivery are examined. The topics collectively focus on the political, social, ethical and economic impacts of policy. The course will identify and examine the ethical dilemmas in community that provide the foundation for activism. An examination of research in disability provides an opportunity for the student to learn, understand and compare legislation, policy and ethical frameworks that inform action.
