Course Description: This course provides a broad survey of the human past as illuminated by archaeology, from the emergence of humans and Paleolithic cultures to the rise (and fall) of civilizations and empires. Topics are arranged to track local sequences from the beginnings of food production to the development of complex societies in several zones of the Old and New Worlds.
