### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course provides an introduction to the theory, method, and practice of archaeological reconnaissance and survey. Site discovery and assessment are fundamental to the practice of archaeology. Students will conduct field reconnaissance and survey to gain real world experience in approaches to data collection and recording. Archaeological survey is a team effort and students will work in teams as they practice survey techniques, land navigation using compass and global positioning instruments, mapping, field photography, note taking, and form recording.

Lecture topics include but are not limited to: (1) reconnaissance and survey techniques; (2) general site recording; (3) journal note-taking and field photography; (4) soils, sediments, and stratigraphy; (5) basic sample collection. **TEXTS:** There are no required textbooks.

## **REQUIRED MATERIALS**

Students must purchase a field note book containing both lined and graph pages. University of Calgary physics notebooks are ideal. Students must also bring writing materials including pens and pencils. Personal notebooks should also be purchased.

### **ATTENDANCE**

Archaeological field work is a team effort requiring full time effort. <u>Attendance</u> is required for this course. Students who miss class will be docked 10% for each missed class day.

## TRAVEL AND LOGISTICS

A van will provide return transportation from the Science Theatres Loop at the University of Calgary to the study areas. Students must bring their own drinks, food including water, a lunch, and snacks as there are no stores or other facilities at the sites. Suitable clothing and footwear must be worn and students must bring appropriate sunscreen and effective insect repellant.

While working in the field at the Cluny site, class hours will be from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM every day of the course. These times do not include travel time and students must consider travel time in their planning. Students requiring transportation must be at the meeting place by 8:00 AM.
