Course description:	Foundation course in two-dimensional art making. Creative exploration of pictorial space, composition and design will occur via learning fundamentals of perspective, colour, shape, balance and unity.  Approaches may include wet and dry media, digital technologies, printmaking, and collage. These will be addressed in the context of research, problem solving, visual fluency and conceptual development. This course may not be repeated for credit.

These include: composition, pictorial space, shape, value, colour, signs and symbols within class discussions, critiques and course activities.</li> </ol> </li> <li>There is no required textbook</li> </ol>
