Course Description

Theory and methods of creating meaningful art experiences for children aged 6 to 12, with a practical component.

Prerequisites &/or Co-requisites

Art 205, 231 and 233

Objectives of the Course

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- -Form a rationale for art in formal educational settings;
- -Demonstrate an understanding of the role of art in children's learning;
- -Demonstrate an expanded repertoire of skills and knowledge of art materials and concepts appropriate to children's learning;
- -Demonstrate the ability to design practical teaching situations for young students based upon sound learning theory

Assignments and Evaluation

The final grade will consist of the following components:

1. e-Portfolio

-Initial Set Up, incl: Intro pages, bio, letter of intent 5% (Due Sept. 15, 2015) - Final Submission, including letter of assessment 5% (Due Dec. 3, 2015)

2. Practical Experience	40%	(Part A: Project Plan due Oct. 1, 2015; Part B: Lesson Plans due Nov. 5, 2015; Part C: Program Assessment due Dec. 3, 2015)
3. Blog	30%	(Assessed Oct. 13 & Dec. 3, 2015)
4. Participation	20%	(Assessed on Oct. 13 and Dec. 3, 2015)

Assignments are submitted electronically through your e-Portfolio or the blog site with artworks fully documented through digital photographs that are posted thereon.

Student's participation requires active participation in class discussions, field observation and practical teaching experiences, including:

- (1) Attendance at field and practical experiences and in-class planning and de-briefing sessions;
- (2) Documenting your learning during Art 307 and that of the children and teachers involved in the practicum experience;
- (3) Interactive participation in class discussions;
- (4) Active membership in group work.

Writing

The quality of the students' writing will be a factor in determining the grade for assignments that require writing. Grammar and spelling must be correct. Further, articulate and eloquent prose will communicate students' ideas more clearly, and contribute to stronger grades.

Note: No work will be accepted later than one week after the last day of lectures. All assignments must be completed in order to pass the class. Further, a passing grade on the "Practical Experience" component of the class is required in order to pass the class.

Please hand in your assignments directly to your instructor. If this is not possible, you can use the drop box outside of AB 608. Assignments that are put into the drop box will be date-stamped and placed in the instructor's mailbox.

Late Assignment Policy

Due dates are final unless otherwise negotiated with the instructor. Late assignments will receive a grade penalty of up to 1% per day of lateness during the first week after the due date. Thereafter, late assignments will receive a grade penalty of 5% per day of lateness. NO WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED, WITHOUT PRIOR ARRANGEMENT, AFTER THE LAST DAY OF CLASSES IN THE FINAL DUE DATE (i.e., DECEMBER 8, 2015).

Additional Information

You may be required to "scrounge" materials for the practical experience. This is an important skill for art educators, as materials budgets in schools and community settings are very tight to non-existent. Creative re-purposing of materials is a skill you will develop. Art 307 will give you the opportunity to learn how to make "something from nothing!"

Course Activities

This course utilises research, studio exploration, lectures, class discussion and a practical experience. It is the students' responsibility to secure transportation and to pay any associated fees regarding the practical experience.
