Further work in photography, using film and silver-based photographic materials including intensive use of the variables of exposure, film development and silver-based printing of photographic materials

Objectives of the Course

Introductory level work in photography photographic practice using silver-based and digital photographic materials will be undertaken. This will include intensive use of the variables of exposure, composition, negative development, silver-based printing of photographic materials, digital scanning and printing, artistic concept development and development of a spoken and written vocabulary regarding photographic art.

Technical Issues:

1. Composition, lighting, focus, exposure, sharpness etc.

I suggest you purchase a couple rolls of 24 exposure and the rest in 36 exposure Most students will shoot 10 to 20 rolls over the class.
