Course description:	An exploration of the cognitive, emotional, and social development of infants, children and adolescents learning art. Students will engage in experiential learning in formal and informal settings.

Course Objectives:	By the completion of this course, successful students will be able to:  1. Form a rationale for artistic and creative development in formal education and community settings from birth to the end of adolescence.  2. Demonstrate an understanding of creative, collaborative, critical thinking, and communicative development conducive to development from birth to adolescence through the creation of educational environments of collaborative creativity.  3. Demonstrate an expanded repertoire of skills and knowledge of art materials, media, and concepts appropriate to artistic and creative development from birth to the end of adolescence.  4. Demonstrate the ability to design educational environments and learning experiences from birth through the end of adolescence conducive to artistic and creative development within formal education and community-based contexts  5. Demonstrate an understanding to the unique creative development of each person with equity and innovation encompassing a full spectrum of abilities, accessibility and cultural sensitivity.
