Course description:	Technical and conceptual exploration of painting, with experimentation in at least two media, including acrylic and/or oil. May include colour theory, painting style, application of materials and different painting supports.			
Prerequisites and/or co- requisites:	ART 231 or 241			
Course Objectives:	By the completion of this course, successful students will possess a foundation knowledge of painting techniques and painting materials. The course's emphasis upon thematic creative research will prepare students to develop their future individual concepts and creative ideas. As well, students will gain experience with experimental and exploratory artistic processes in painting. Students will benefit from engaging intellectually and verbally in the class on-going discussions relating to their artistic production.			
	The course will attempt to produce student participants who are self-motivated, confident in their aspirations, competent in their chosen methodologies, demonstrate clarity of concepts and are able to produce a body of high-quality work.			
	It is expected that portfolio submissions will reflect a <u>minimum</u> commitment of ten hours per week.			
	Please note that this is an interactive course. Most information will be presented verbally and cannot be repeated for the benefit of late or absent individuals.
