DESCRIPTION

This course is a continuation of the beginner's courses (GREK 201 and 203) for the study of the ancient Greek language, emphasising the skills and knowledge necessary for reading ancient texts, including vocabulary, word-forms, and syntax. The language learned in this class is Attic Greek, the language of the Athenian writers Sophocles, Thucydides, Xenophon and Plato (5th and 4th centuries BCE). This is the basis of the 'common language' (*Koiné*) of the Hellenistic and Roman periods (3rd century BCE to 5th century CE). This course also prepares students to read texts in related Greek dialects, including Homer and Herodotus, as well as the New Testament and other early Christian writings.
