Course Description:

Don't you love a good story with great characters? Gods, goddesses, heroes, monsters, epic wars, true love, tricksters, witches... This course has it all! It's an introduction to the myths, legends, and folktales presented in Classical literature and art.

Learning Outcomes:

Students will learn the characters and plots of a number of major Classical myths; they will develop skills in closely reading and analysing literary texts and art images within their cultural context; they will become familiar with a number of themes and story patterns in Classical myth; they will be able to identify the major characters of Classical myth in art; and they will gain some insight into the reception and continuation of Classical myth in the modern world.
