**Course Description:**

An introduction to Greek and Roman myths as presented in classical literature and art, and to their cultural context.

The Exams will test the students' comprehension of 1) the readings assigned from the required textbooks (see separate Schedule of Lectures and Assigned Readings), especially the ancient authors excerpted therein; and 2) the mythological images shown and discussed in class, especially those reproduced in Morford's textbook.
