1. Annotated Bibliography (due Tuesday, 12 March)	20%

The *Annotated Bibliography* is a description and evaluation of the primary and secondary sources you will need to use for your Term Paper. The *Term Paper* will make use of this evidence to address questions about Sacred Space, Sacred Time, or Sacred Action (specific topics will be supplied in due time). The *Mid-Term Exam* will consist of an in-class essay on a theoretical question concerning Roman religion, based on a quotation from the textbooks. You will be provided the Mid-Term questions a week before the exam, so that you may have time to prepare to write on one question of your choice.
