REQUIRED TEXTS:

There is no required textbook. Students are encouraged to read as much as possible about archaic Greece. Please consult the Cambridge Histories on line as well as books and articles on the topics discussed in class. Bibliography will be provided in class.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The classical period is regarded as the apex of ancient Greek history, and on it the spotlight is inevitably shone when speaking of the achievements of the ancient Greeks. However, the classical period was preceded by several formative centuries which laid the groundwork, making these achievements possible. The primary aim of this course is to study the main historical developments of these formative centuries, from the Bronze Age to the period just before the Persian Wars (roughly 3000-500 BC), a time-period collectively known as "Early Greece".
