COURSE OBJECTIVE:

Students will learn the basic methodology of historical study and attempt to show their understanding in written work.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

3 written assignments (c. 2000 words each) on topics from lists provided
by instructor (each worth 30% of the grade for the course; due dates
21 October; 18 November; 5 December) 90%
Class participation 10%

Essays must be submitted on or before due dates. Extensions are not available except in unusual circumstances; work commitments elsewhere (either academic or non-academic) or equipment failure (automobiles, computers, printers, etc.) will not qualify. Essays submitted after deadlines without prior permission or essays submitted after the closing period of an agreed extension will not be read. The grade in such cases will be 0.

NOTES:

1. The **withdrawal deadline** for this course is 5 December 2014. The Instructor will inform the students of their grades currently earned in the course by four weeks before this deadline. **The last day to withdraw from this course with refund of fees is 19 September 2014.**

NUMERICAL GRADING SCHEME FOR COURSES BASED ON ESSAY WORK

Essays are assessed in terms of the quality indicated in the first column, then assigned a letter grade on that basis. The numerical value is the same for all examples of a particular letter grade (column 3), except very occasionally for some specific purpose. Because calculations will not always fall exactly on those numerical values, column 4 denotes the range of calculated values that will result in the grade specified in column 2. In principle, grades near the upper end of a range are not rounded up, since the bottom of the next range delineates the minimum value; in reality, however, grades may be rounded up if a good reason for doing so presents itself.
