**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

How did select Romans emphasize their identity on their funerary monuments? How did this identity transmit into the world of the living? In this course, we will explore Roman funerary art from the late Republic through to the late Empire. In doing so, we will identify

- 1) examples of Roman burial and tomb types; 2) the visual vocabulary used to convey status,
- 2) gender, memory, and identity on Roman funerary monuments; and,
- 3) Roman rituals and laws concerning the afterlife.

A schedule of readings and a document outlining details of and key dates for the course requirements will be distributed on the first day of class.
