COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to introduce you to the basic vocabulary and grammar of Classical Latin as covered in Chapters 1 – 18 of *Wheelock's Latin*. By the end of the term, you should be able to compose simple Latin sentences and translate elementary passages of Latin.
