Peter V. Jones and Keith C. Sidwell, *Reading Latin: Text; Grammar, Vocabulary and Exercises; An Independent Study Guide* (Cambridge UP). All 3 volumes are needed from the beginning of the course and are available in the University Bookstore.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is the second half of an intensive language course focused on the structure of Latin and providing the first steps towards reading Latin texts. The in-class quizzes and mid-term exam will test students' command of vocabulary, grammar and syntax and the ability to translate English into Latin and Latin into English. The final exam will consist of exercises in Latin grammar and syntax, as well as unseen passages for translation at sight from Latin into English. A detailed syllabus will be provided to you on the first day of class outlining required readings and dates.
