Course Description: This course will continue on from LATI 201, introducing you to the principles of Classical Latin. In order to grasp the vocabulary and grammar, you will submit assignments on D2L and write quizzes and midterms in class. By the end of the semester you will have increased your Latin vocabulary, be able to compose relatively simple Latin sentences, and translate slightly more complex Latin passages.
