Course Description: This course continues on from LATI 201, introducing the basic components of the Latin language, emphasising the skills and knowledge necessary for reading ancient texts, including vocabulary, morphology and syntax. The language learned in this course (and the follow-on course, LATI 301) is Classical Latin, the language of the Roman writers Livy, Vergil and Horace. Knowledge of Classical Latin is the foundation for reading Medieval and Renaissance Latin.
