Course Overview:

This course is an introduction to the Sanskrit language. We will cover the Devanagari script, noun and pronoun declensions, verb conjugations, sandhi, etc. The course is designed as the first half of a year long course. As is the custom in North American universities, the first year of Sanskrit covers enough Sanskrit grammar to prepare students to begin reading primary Sanskrit materials in the second year.

Word of Warning:

The time expectation for this course is between 10 and 20 hours per week. (10 hours to get by, around 20 hours to do well enough to get an A.) This is the only way to learn Sanskrit adequately in the early stages. There will be quizzes every Friday, including the first Friday of the semester that cannot be missed. This course requires a lot of memorization. It takes practice, but you will improve quickly. If, however, you are one of these people who tell themselves they cannot memorize things, and you plan to continue telling yourself this, spare yourself and do not take this course!

Required Readings:

Madhav M. Deshpande, *Samskrtasubodhini: A Sanskrit Primer* (Ann Arbor, MI: Centers for South and Southeast Asian Studies, University of Michigan, 2003).

* In order to avoid falling behind, this book must be brought to the first class of the semester.

Suggested Materials:

Many, many packets of blank notecards (for flashcards) Recording device (for recording and listening to paradigms, verb conjugations, vocabulary, etc.)

Evaluation:

Students will take a quiz every Friday covering the week's material. There will also be a final writing assignment – a translation – due during finals weeks. Participation and homework will also count heavily toward the final grade.
