Required Text:

The Religions of Tibet, by Giuseppe Tucci

Course Description:

This course is focused on the religious developments of Tibet, with emphasis on religious history, literature and philosophy and their contemporary implications.

Core Competencies:

Students will become aware of the key concepts and cultural factors in the development of Tibetan religions. They will gain knowledge of key issues, methodological considerations, and resources in the understanding of religion in the Tibetan setting as well as in the diaspora.

Course Requirements:

There will be 1 in-class test , 1 term paper and an oral presentation of the student's research findings. Total possible points = 100

A research paper (10-12 pages of text, typed, double spaced, notes and bibliography) is required for this course. Research topics are open within the confines of the course description above, but must be approved by the professor. Only hard copy papers will be accepted. Computer problems of any kind are unacceptable excuses for late papers.

There will be no Registrar scheduled final examination.
