Course Description:

This course is designed to examine Taoism, and its relations with Confucianism and Chinese Spiritual Culture in general. The history, doctrine, rituals, and cultural aspects of Taoism as well as the interactions between the three traditions will be presented. This course will provide the student with an in-depth understanding of development of Taoism within Chinese culture through lectures, films, slides, readings and other sources in a seminar-like structured class.

Core Competencies:

Students will be exposed to cultural, philosophical and historic elements found within the Taoist tradition. Modern research methods will be demonstrated. Facts, authorities, and movements will be studied. Students will be instructed on proper presentations of their findings in both oral and written forms.

Course Requirements:

There will be one test, one research paper, and an oral presentation used in the evaluation of student's work.

A research paper (10-12 pages of text, typed, double spaced, notes and bibliography) is required for this course. Research topics are open within the confines of the course description above, but must be approved by the professor. Only hard copy papers will be accepted. Computer problems of any kind are unacceptable excuses for late papers.
