The Bible and Film***

Content and Objectives:

Truman and Adam share a great escape while a long-suffering priest lends counsel to a lunatic writer. The audience winces as a misogynist sweet-talks his way to forgiveness, and then laughs as gun-totting thugs debate divine miracles. A magician stages a resurrection, writers plagiarize foreign material, monologic truth fades on the battleground of faith. The Logos of the Greeks slips into a computer as a modern-day thief sinks deeper into sub-conscious espionage. Students of this course will academically engage multiple adventures in(to) cinematic and biblical worlds and in doing so, will analyze the impact that mental assumptions have on one's perception of both virtuality and reality, a postmodern update of Isaiah's *the reader/viewer sees many things, but does not observe them; his ears are open, but he does not hear*" (42:20).

Assessments:

Six Online Tests - 50%

Non-cumulative and equally-weighted, using a variety of assessment styles from multiple choice to short-answer, available in Blackboard on: Jan 16-17, Jan 31-Feb 1, Feb 14-15, Mar 7-8, Mar 21-22, and Apr 4-5.

Six Analytical Responses - 50%

Students will submit electronically (in Blackboard's Digital Dropbox) six analytical responses (maximum length, 600 words), one for each film viewed in this course. The deadlines for these submissions will be at noon on Jan 26, Feb 9, Mar 2, Mar 16, Mar 30, Apr 17.

Participation Bonus – 1-10% per response

A bonus rewarding good viewing protocol will be given for each film (up to 10%), to be applied to the respective analytical response.

There will be no registrar scheduled final exam for this course

Student Expectations:

Students will be given only one attempt to write each test. Should a University-related problem occur (one that can be confirmed by the IT department), then that student will write in-person a make-up test in the Religious Studies Department between April 15-17 (exam time to be announced).

No remedial assignments are available to students who fail to submit an analytical response. A passing grade on any of the graded components is not essential for passing the course.
