Course Description:

This course introduces the student to the fundamentals of the literature on social choice and public choice. The social choice literature emphasizes the normative properties of voting rules, political competition, and social welfare functions. The public choice literature emphasizes how interest groups, bureaucracy, the judiciary, and legislative and executive bodies of government interact and compete.
