Course Outline:

The course will introduce basic concepts in game theory to prepare the ground for other topics to be discussed in the class. The course tentatively plans to discuss the following set of topics: Market Experiments, Bargaining and Social Preferences, Coordination Games, Public Goods Games, Auctions, Information and Social Learning, Network Games, Dominance Solvable Games, etc.

Grade Determination and Final Examination Details:

There are three in-class, closed book and notes, comprehensive exams:

Class Participation: 10 points (based on how prepared you are for class and the extent to which you participate in class discussions—that is, the quality of your questions, answers, commentary, and criticisms in the classroom)

First Midterm Exam – 25 points (Exam Date: Feb 24)
 Second Midterm Exam – 25 points (Exam Date: March 19)
 Final Exam – 40 points (Exam Date: University decided)

Tests and final exams are marked on a numerical (percentage) basis, then converted to letter grades. The course grade is then calculated using the weights indicated above. As a guide to determining standing, these letter grade equivalences will apply:

A passing grade on any particular component of the course is not required for a student to pass the course as a whole.

Non-programmable calculators will not be allowed during the writing of tests or final examinations. There will be a Registrar scheduled final examination, held in a classroom, lasting 2 hours.

Tests and exams will not involve multiple-choice questions.
