Course Outline:

The objective of this course is to use the tools of microeconomic analysis, institutional economics, and econometrics, to understand energy markets. Course content will focus on empirical studies of the energy business including natural gas markets, crude oil markets, gasoline markets, electricity markets, coal markets, and public policies affecting energy markets.

Students enrolled in this course are expected to be familiar with microeconomic theory at the level of Silberberg and Suen's *The Structure of Economics: A Mathematical Analysis* and econometrics at the level of Jack Johnston's *Econometrics*.

A more detailed course outline with downloadable materials will be available through the Blackboard web portal. Most of the readings for the course will be readily and freely downloadable on the course web page directly, or indirectly through a link to JSTOR, or the electronic journal.

Students will be required to write a term paper and to present to the class. Students are required to actively participate in class. .../2
