### Course Outline:

Economics 611.28 will be an informal workshop series for students in the Ph.D. program. The goal of the course is to give post-comprehensive exam Ph.D. students a forum for developing their thesis ideas, practicing their presentation skills and provide an opportunity to learn how to collegially participate in seminars. We will pursue these goals through (i) informal presentations, (ii) workshopping research ideas and preliminary findings, and (iii) writing and organizational tips to help focus one's research.

It is expected that all Ph.D. students having completed their comprehensive exams will participate in this non-graded course. Failure to participate may affect a student's attainment of "satisfactory progress" in the Ph.D. program. This in turn may affect funding, teaching assistant allocations, and sessional teaching appointments for Ph.D students.

### Course Details

1. The course will meet on Fridays from 10-12 throughout the fall term and 11-12:30 in the winter terms (unless otherwise indicated).
2. The course will be facilitated by a faculty member who will arrange the schedule and monitor attendance and participation.
3. Post-comprehensive exam Ph.D. students are expected to present research ideas, papers at

an early stage of development, or completed work at least once in each term. Presenting in this course does not acquit post-candidacy students from the responsibility to present in the departmental seminar series.
