Course Outline:

This course is the second part of a pair of courses with the following objectives:

1. To provide you with an opportunity to engage in sustained and intensive study of a topic by developing, writing, and presenting a research paper.
2. To apply empirical and theoretical skills that you have acquired and developed from core curriculum courses
3. To develop your research skills and written communication skills
4. Where possible (or if you are lucky enough), to produce original results that contribute to our understanding of economics

A detailed course outline will be distributed in the first week of lectures.

The research paper will be developed from the research conducted in the first course.

There will be two dates for oral presentations: August 3-4 2011.

Grade Determination and Final Examination Details:

The final grade will be based on the elements and weights below:

Complete paper	65%
Presentation	25%
