#### **Course Description:**

The course examines the relationship of literature to the world around us, with instruction in close reading and critical writing. It considers how literature as a cultural practice responds to and reflects its social context. It includes the study of at least one text by an indigenous author. This course may not be repeated for credit. The semester work focuses on modern themes, styles and techniques in literature.

#### **Course Learning Outcomes:**

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate intermediate-level knowledge of a range of literary writings;
- 2. Understand and interpret modern literary texts in relation to their historical and cultural contexts;
- 3. Pay close attention to the language of a literary text;
- 4. Write a convincing academic term paper using the conventions of English as an academic discipline;
- 5. Engage in meaningful conversations about literature with peers.

#### **Assessments and Evaluation:**

- There will be a midterm examination and a Registrar-scheduled final examination in this course. Students must be available for examinations during the entire examination period. No extra credit assignments will be given.
- Students will write two essays. Both essays must be submitted through D2L. Acceptable file formats for submission are word docx, doc and pdf.
- Students need not complete all assignments, or any particular assignment, in order to qualify for a passing grade in this grade.
- Penalty for late assignments:
  - O Assignments submitted after the deadline will be penalized with the loss of a third of a grade (e.g., an A- to B+) for each calendar day that the assignment is overdue. No assignments will be accepted one week past the assignment deadline.

#### **Attendance and Participation Expectations:**

Students are expected to attend class regularly and to be fully present and engaged in class activities and discussions.

- Final grades will never be rounded up. For a student to earn any particular letter grade in the course, they must have surpassed the minimum threshold of that grade category, without rounding.
- A+ is solely an honorific that entails no additional points in the four-point system. Grade A+ will be employed to distinguish superlative work that far exceeds expectations in style, correctness, intellectual depth and breadth, sophistication, and originality.
- Any kind of plagiarism is strictly prohibited. Plagiarism occurs when a student presents the ideas, expression of ideas, or work of another person as their own. Another equally serious form of plagiarism occurs when a student submits something they have written themselves for credit in two or more courses without first securing written permission from all those course instructors. Using any source whatsoever without clearly documenting it is a serious academic offense. Students are advised to follow MLA citation style in all assignments.
