Course Content:

Systematic survey of the physical, cultural and historical geography of Latin America.

Course Topics:

1. Introduction: General comparison to other world regions, outstanding characteristics-physical/cultural.
2. Physical landscape: Natural regions-physiography and drainage and climate. Natural vegetation and soils. Native animal life.
3. Historical background: Pre-Columbian Amerindian cultures. European background, exploration, conquest and settlement. Historical development: colonial period, independence movement, modern period.
4. Cultural Features: Population: historical and present-day trends. Distribution and settlement patterns, urbanization. Races, languages, religions.
5. Economy: Historic economic development. Characteristics of the economy: general features of underdevelopment.

Course Format:

- a) Equivalent of three hours of lecture per week.
