Course Content:

The course will be divided into two sections:

- 1) A very brief overview of the physical patterns of Canada with reference to the significance for human occupance and land use.
- 2) A focus on the regions of Canada, for each region the themes will include:
 - (i) The emergence of the socio-economic and urban patterns from earliest times
 - (ii) The present socio-economic and urban character
 - (iii) Selected issues and problems of importance
