## **Official Course Description:**

The course focuses on the question of gender in modern North American urban environments. It examines how the material layout of cities, as well as, the social boundaries that also divide the city into various spaces, reinforce (and challenge) gender ideologies. The notion of gender is not only approached dichotomously, in terms of men's and women's gender roles, but is also considered in relation to class, race, age, and sexual orientation. The course thus considers the manner in which the spatial boundaries and physical architectures of cities constrain or advantage particular groups and identities.

Students will produce an original piece of research on a topic of their choice. The paper will be between 2500-3000 words and will use proper citation. Possible topics will be discussed in class.

# Urban Ethnography Project (25%)

### March 18th

Students will produce an urban ethnography or auto-ethnography project in which they investigate an urban space from the perspective of gender and document that investigation through images, text, film, or a combination of these media. A more indepth description and marking rubric will be presented in-class.

# Mid-term (10%)

## February 27

The midterm will be a synthesis of the readings and will demand students be able to answer thematic questions based on their understanding of the course materials.

# Final Quiz (5%)

### April 10

The final quiz will be a synthesis of the readings and will demand students be able to answer thematic questions based on their understanding of the course materials.
