History 491.01 is the first part of a two-part sequence in the history of European international relations and foreign policies of the major European powers from the French Revolution to the First World War. In course lectures and assigned readings, students will examine the sources of continuity and elements of change in 19th century European international history. Over the course, we will evaluate the role of individuals, groups, institutions, ideologies, and publics on foreign policy as well as assessing the influence of politics, economics, technology, and culture. This course is a prerequisite for HTST 489.02 Espionage and the State
