**Course Description:**

The student will attend and participate in a human anatomy dissection and preparation session for 2 hours under the supervision of the Instructor. A dissection plan will be developed by the student and approved by the Instructor and regular updates will help guide the student through their dissection each week. Each week the students will review the upcoming KNES 259 Anatomy Lab and assist the Instructor and KNES 259 GATs in the preparation and set-up for the Lab. In addition, each week the student will choose another time(s) for 2 hours of self-directed dissection. The students are expected to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner and treat all cadavers with respect at all times while in the lab.

**Course Objectives:**

To provide students with the experience of dissecting human cadaveric specimens.

**Pedagogical Objectives:**

- The student will be able to complete a dissection plan, modify the plan according to the cadaveric specimen, and execute the plan through the hands-on dissection of the cadaver.
- The student will be able to engage in open discussions about human anatomy, anatomical dissection, anatomical system interaction, and clinical application of anatomical knowledge with the Instructor and the other dissection students.
- The student will be able to teach the other students and Instructor one lab from the KNEs 259: Human: Physiology I in preparation for assisting and helping the KNES 259 students to learn the course material.

**Supplies:**

Students must provide their own lab coat  
Hypoallergenic powder free gloves are provided in the laboratory

**Contacting the Instructor:**
