2. **Prerequisite(s): Math 249 or 251 or Amat 217** **Corequisite: None**

3. **Fee Policy:** After the last day to drop/add courses, there will be no refund of tuition fees if a student withdraws from a course, courses or the session.

<b>Mid-term Test (50 mins.)</b>	<b>25%</b>
<b>Quizzes (5 × 50 mins.)</b>	<b>15%</b>
<b>Final Exam (120 mins.)</b>	<b>50%</b>

There will be a final examination scheduled by the Registrar's Office. Students must obtain at least a grade "D" on the final examination in order to obtain an overall final grade of D or better.

6. **Missed Components of Term Work.** The regulations of the Faculty of Science pertaining to this matter are outlined in the current University Calendar, *Faculty of Science, Section 6A*. It is the student's responsibility to familiarize herself/himself with these regulations.

8. There will be one mid-term in-class examination.
9. **Recommended Reading:** either *Calculus: a Complete Course* or *Calculus: Single Variable* by R. A. Adams, Addison-Wesley.
10. **Calculators:** The use of calculators during quizzes, the midterm test, or final examination is **not** permitted.
11. **Homework & Quizzes:** Homework problems will be assigned (approximately) weekly, and these are to be completed using the computer homework system WEBWORK which can be accessed at <http://webwork.ucalgary.ca>. Each student will have an account and the assignments can be done from any computer with web access. Your answers to the assignment questions will be checked and marked (by the computer) on a right/wrong basis. Details about the system and how to use it will be provided during the term.

The weekly tutorials are each of 50 minute duration. If you have problems with any questions you can ask your tutorial instructor for help during this time. In addition, during five of these tutorials (roughly every other week; see the course schedule) there will be a quiz of 45 minutes duration. These will be held in the computer room MS317, and will again use the Webwork system. They will also be *Open Book*. You can bring any textbook and/or your notes, but Calculators will not be allowed.

There is in addition the Continuous Tutorial where you can come and ask a tutor for help on a drop-in basis. This tutorial will be held in MS365, MTWR 11:00 – 15:00 and F 11:00 – 14:00.

**NOTES:**

1. The section numbers refer to the text *Calculus: a Complete Course* by Adams. Some departures from this schedule may take place.
2. The Midterm is scheduled for the week of March 5 to March 09. No Calculators will be allowed.
3. By the end of each week you should have mastered the sections of the text indicated on the course schedule and the corresponding assignment. You should prepare for each lecture by reading the text and for each tutorial by attempting to do as many exercises as possible in advance. Math is like weight-lifting – the more reps you do, the stronger you get! In addition to the assigned WEBWORK problems there are many problems in the textbook that you can try. The answers to the odd-numbered exercises are given in the back of the book, so we recommend that you try these first. Your lectures will not necessarily cover everything in detail; they should guide you in your study of the text. Similarly, your tutorial instructor should help you diagnose your difficulties and teach you how to overcome them.
