### MATH 265 L01 – (Winter 2015) – University Calculus I

2. **Prerequisites:** A grade of 70 per cent or higher in Mathematics 30-1 or Pure Mathematics 30; and a grade of 50 per cent or higher in Mathematics 31. (Alternatives to Pure Mathematics 30 are presented in C.1 Mathematics Diagnostic Test in the Academic Regulations section of this Calendar).
3. **Grading:** The University policy on grading and related matters is described sections [F.1](#) and [F.2](#) of the online University Calendar. In determining the overall grade in the course the following weights will be used:

Assignments (6)	25%
Midterm test	25% (March 2 <sup>nd</sup> from 7:00 – 9:00pm)
Final Examination	50% (To be scheduled by the Registrar)

The various components above will be assigned a percentage score and will be combined with the indicated weights to produce an overall percentage in the course. The conversion of the percentage grade to a letter grade is done according to the table below. A grade of 40% or higher in the final examination is essential for an overall grade of C or better. If the student's score in the final exam is less than 40%, a D grade or lower will result. This is to ensure that those students who receive a C or better have a reasonable chance to succeed in courses that require this course as a prerequisite.
