Webwork Assignments (06)	12%
Term Tests (02)	38% (Week of Feb 9 and of March 16)
Final Examination	50% (To be scheduled by the Registrar)

The various components above will be assigned a percentage score and will be combined with the indicated weights to produce an overall percentage in the course. The conversion of the percentage grade to a letter grade is done according to the table below. A grade of 40% or higher in the final examination is essential for an overall grade of **C-**, or better. If the student's score in the final exam is less than 40%, a **D** grade or lower will result. This is to ensure that those students who receive a **C-** or better have a reasonable chance to succeed in courses that require this course as a prerequisite.
