Midterm 2 (Take home)	20%
Final Project	20%

Each piece of work (midterm tests and final project) submitted by the student will be assigned a percentage score. The student's average percentage score for the various components listed above will be combined with the indicated weights to produce an overall percentage for the course, which will be used to determine the course letter grade.
