A passing mark on the final exam – at least 50%- is required in order to earn a minimum grade of C- in this course.

Each piece of work (assignments, midterm tests or final examination submitted by the student will be assigned a percentage score. The student's average percentage score for the various components listed above will be combined with the indicated weights to produce an overall percentage for the course, which will be used to determine the course letter grade **[bearing in mind that a maximum grade of D will result if the student does not pass the final exam]**, The conversion between course percentage and letter grade is given below:

Monocle is web-based system that allows immediate interactive feedback and graphical simulations, to both aid and assist in the understanding of course material.
