#### ***COURSE DESCRIPTION***

This course is an introduction to first-order logic. The syntax and semantics of first-order sentences, tests of validity, and proofs of the correctness and completeness of some of these tests will be presented in class.

#### ***REQUIRED TEXT***

Richard Jeffrey, *Formal Logic: Its Scope and Limits*, 4<sup>th</sup> edition.

#### ***EVALUATION***

There will be three in-class examinations. The first two examinations will be weighted 30% of the final mark each, and the third examination will be weighted 10% of the final mark. In addition, there will be eight equally weighted take-home assignments. The best six of these will determine 30% of the final mark. There will be no Registrar-scheduled final examination.
