Course Description

This course is an introduction to Bioethics—the study of ethical issues that arise in the context of contemporary medicine and health care. Issues we will discuss include: end of life medical decisions; reproductive rights; genetic technologies; and scarce medical resource allocation. The aim of the course is to provide students with a genuine understanding of some of the central issues in bioethics in order to participate in the ongoing debates in an informed, critical and responsible manner.

Required Texts

As we move along, which readings we will be discussing will be announced in class and posted on Blackboard.

Course Requirements, Evaluation and Due Dates

- Two papers: The first paper, 1000 words, is due **July 22** and worth 25% of the total grade; second paper, 1500 words, is due **August 17** and worth 35% of the total grade.
- In-class exam: **July 29**, worth 30% of the total grade.
- One critical analysis, 300 words, is due **Aug 5**, worth 10% of the total grade.

There will NOT be a Registrar-scheduled final exam. No assignment is such that a passing grade on it is required to pass the course.

Course Policies

Assignments are to be submitted in class (with the exception of the last).
