An examination of ethical issues related to information technology such as privacy, surveillance, intellectual property, computational enhancement, freedom of expression versus online censorship, hacking, information overload, social media, virtual reality, algorithms, robotics, artificial intelligence, and design.

- Broad knowledge and comprehension of a diverse set of philosophical issues, concepts, problems, traditions, and views relevant to information technology ethics.
- Ability to critically, fairly, clearly, thoughtfully, and charitably, state, explain, evaluate, and discuss basic arguments and ideas for various positions relevant to information technology ethics.

## **COURSE ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION**

Participation 10%

The participation grade is based on regular, polite, civil, respectful, and thoughtful participation in class. A student can earn one participation point per class so long as that participation makes a meaningful contribution and/or has the potential to generate further discussion.

Alternatively, if a student is unable to participate in a class, they may earn one participation point for that class by posting in the appropriate forum on the D2L site within 24 hours of that class ending. The post must be a short paragraph that states what the student takes to be the main/most interesting/most important point from the reading discussed in the class they were not able to participate in, and what they thought about that point.

The participation grade is determined by adding the participation points from eligible in-class and forum participation (up to a maximum of 10 points).

Quiz: starts Tuesday, August 9	15%

All exams will be the same format: short answer questions. Exams can be accessed via D2L. You have a limited time to write the exam once started, and the exam will only be available for a 24-hour period (from 9pm after class until 8:59 the following day). Exams cannot be taken on days other than those indicated, unless communicated otherwise, without prior arrangement or an acceptable excuse. The exams are semi-open book. Students may use their own personal notes and the readings. No other materials are permitted and students are not permitted to communicate with one another about the exam until all students have written the exam.
