
2. I received a PhD here at the U of C, in 2016. My research was on how the idea of belief is related to the idea of a good belief.

At the end of every other class I will assign you a reflection question worth 2% that is due before next class. Six total (12%)


There will be six short online quizzes worth 6% each available at the end of class every other week and due before the next class. Six total (36%)
