**COURSE INFORMATION**

The goal of the course is to introduce students to the philosophical issues concerning the environment. Basic ethical theories and concepts, as well as specific issues such as animal rights, human and global ecology, production, consumption and pollution will be covered in detail.

**PREREQUISITE(S)**

There are no prerequisites for this course.

**COURSE OBJECTIVES/LEARNING OUTCOMES**

- Introduce students to ethical issues in the environmental arena
- Familiarize students with central texts and topics in the area of environmental ethics
- Help students develop rhetorical and logical skills for argumentative writing

**REQUIRED/RECOMMENDED TEXTBOOKS, READINGS AND MATERIALS**

The assigned text for the course is Byron Williston's *Environmental Ethics for Canadians* (Oxford University Press, 2015). It is available in the bookstore and online.

**COURSE ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION**

There will be three grades assigned in the course

- A mid-term exam, worth 30%
- A research term paper, worth 35%
- A choice between a second paper and a group presentation, worth 35%

**There will NOT be a Registrar-scheduled final exam.**

**Mid-Term Exam:** The mid-term will be an in-class exam, comprised of both short and long answer questions.

**Term Paper:** The term papers must be research papers on an issue pertinent to the class, 8-10 pages (2000-2500 words) long, with a bibliography. The first is due after the reading break. The second is due on the last day of classes. See below for the decision to do a second paper or presentation.

**Group Presentations:** Students must decide by the first paper deadline whether they want to do a (3-4 person) group presentation. Those who choose to do a group presentation can submit either the first or second paper. I will ask for lists of groups during the first week back from break.

**Late Assignments:**

To pass this course, you must complete all assignments. Assignments are to be submitted at the beginning of class. Late work may be penalized, depending on the nature of the delay. Late assignments can be submitted by email but will not receive comments.
