Course Description

We will be comparing notions of the self with those of mind, soul, subject of experience, agent, and person. We will be looking into claims that the self or aspects of the self are illusory. We will examine the kinds of self-control that occur during meditation, and investigate attempts at classifying different forms of meditation and analysing the concept of meditation. We will examine claims that meditation leads to insight and explore the relations between meditation and value.

Course Objectives

Throughout the course you will be attempting to come to your own conclusions regarding the issues discussed by assessing arguments for and against the views presented in the readings. You will be developing your ability to comprehend, interpret, and analyse complex sources, as well as to recognise and construct convincing arguments both in writing and orally. You will develop your ability to write a research paper through multiple drafts and give a succinct presentation of some part of it.

Required Texts

Readings will be drawn from contemporary sources in philosophy and psychology and will be available on D2L under Course Documents.

Requirements and Evaluation

Four short papers 1200 words maximum, due Sep 30, Oct 14, Oct 28, Nov 11 submitted electronically to my email address by midnight, the best three of which will be worth 10% each of the course grade. A term paper proposal 500 words maximum submitted electronically due Nov 18 by midnight. A term paper (hard copy) roughly 5000 words worth 60% of the course grade, due in the course drop box opposite my office Friday Dec 8 at 4 pm. A 30 minute class presentation together with your contribution to discussion of other students' presentations will be worth 10% of the course grade.

Late electronically submitted assignments will be marked down by one grade step, e.g. from a B+ to a B, for each day of lateness. There will be a similar penalty for late submission of the term paper, except that the time between Fri and Mon counts as one day. If you are anticipating any difficulty in turning your assignment in on time you must discuss the problem with me before the due date.

I shall be using D2L to post assignments and grades, to confirm what we are reading for the next class, and to provide some questions on those readings. All grades are assigned using a letter scale. Cumulative and final grades will be computed on the D2L site using the following numerical conversion, which has been selected only for ease of calculation:
