Course Overview	<p>From the economy to the environment and from politics to entertainment, creativity is an endlessly renewable resource that offers benefits for all citizens and may well be the most important human element for our future. Students from all disciplines can investigate the practices and processes of creativity and explore the ways in which it can help enrich their lives.</p> <p>Note: A non-major course for students in all faculties. Not available as a course in the Field of Drama. Attendance at selected arts events is mandatory. Students are responsible for the purchase of tickets. Affordability and accessibility will influence the selection of events. Discounted ticket pricing and/or alternative zero-cost events will be arranged whenever possible. This course was formerly Fine Arts 203.</p>
Course Description	Creativity is not exclusive to musicians, performers or artists. Many people incorrectly think that they lack creativity and that it is an ability that cannot be learned. This course is designed to demonstrate that creativity exists in everyone in a multiplicity of ways. It is a skill that can be learned and incorporated into every discipline, decision, and aspect of one's life to generate opportunities and possibilities. Every word, object, and action is an occasion for creative ingenuity. This course will investigate and consider the ways to encourage and foster creativity, as well as means that creativity is thwarted.

Encourage and develop generative thought as a means of creating ideas.</li> <li>3. Develop an awareness of intuition in the creative process.</li> <li>4. Encourage students to play with ideas as a means of developing and realizing creative skills.</li> <li>5. Encourage the expression of emotions as a way of expressing creative inspirations.</li> <li>6. Promote a willingness to take risks and make mistakes as the creative process involves many trials and errors before the realization of a creative inspiration.</li> <li>7. Expand ideas of what constitutes creativity in professional and personal environments.</li> </ol>
